1. DOES YOUR INSTITUTION OFFER NON-CREDIT COMMUNITY EDUCATION COURSES?

- DuPage: Continuing Education is part of Academic Affairs. It is a division within Academic Affairs with about six sub units.
- Elgin: We have a free-standing continuing education department.

- Heartland: Continuing Education at HCC offers open enrollment community education for personal enrichment and professional development. This department also provides customized trainings, youth enrichment programs, CEUs and conference-style learning events.

3. IF YOU DO HAVE A FREE-STANDING COMMUNITY EDUCATION DIVISION OR DEPARTMENT – WHAT IS THE TITLE OF THE PERSON THAT MANAGES THAT DIVISION?

- Daley: The department is managed by a director of community education programs who is supervised by the dean of advanced manufacturing and engineering.
- Danville: Director, Community Education and Video Development
- DuPage: Assistant Vice President/Dean
- Elgin: Jorge Phillips is the director of the department.
- Harper: Assistant Vice President of Workforce Development and Executive Dean of Community Education.
- Heartland: The Dean of Continuing Education oversees community education as part of the overall offerings.
- Illinois Central: Julie Howar, Dean Corporate and Community Education
- Illinois Valley: Director of Continuing Education and Business Services
- Kankakee: Associate Dean of Continuing Ed and Career Services
- Lewis and Clark: Director of High School Partnership and Community Education
- Moraine Valley: The Community Education department is managed by a Senior Program Manager who in turn reports to the Executive Director – Corporate, Community and Continuing Education.
- Prairie State: Manager, Continuing Education and Workforce Development
- South Suburban: Dean of Adult Education. The position reports to the Vice President of Academic Affairs.
- Southeastern: Associate Dean of Workforce and Community Education
- Southwestern: Chief Student and Community Development Officer
- Spoon River: Director, Community Outreach
- Triton: Dean of Continuing Education
- Waubonsee: Dean of Community Education and Corporate Outreach

4. IF YOU DO NOT HAVE A SEPARATE DIVISION OR DEPARTMENT – WHAT DIVISION OR DEPARTMENT IS COMMUNITY EDUCATION A PART OF AT YOUR INSTITUTION?

- Daley: The department resides within the college and is housed under the college's Center of Excellence.
- Elgin: The continuing education department is part of the Workforce Development & Continuing Education division.
- Heartland: Community Education courses fall under the Continuing Education department.

- Illinois Eastern: Academic Affairs
- Kaskaskia: Industrial and Community Education Division. The person who manages the division is the Coordinator of Industrial and Community Education.
- Lake Land: The Community Learning programs are housed under the Center for Business and Industry and are managed by the Director to the Center for Business and Industry.
- Oakton: Oakton Community College community education is part of the larger Academic Affairs division of the college. The title of the person who manages community education is the senior manager of business & community programs. This position reports to the dean of adult/continuing education, all of which are part of Oakton's academic affairs division.
- Prairie State: The department is under the division of Community and Economic Development
- Shawnee: Dean of academics
- South Suburban: Dean of Adult Education. The position reports to the Vice President of Academic Affairs.
